District Deputy Report

We are so close to winning the Star Council Award again this year.

We had a great membership drive last month when Fr Bill Lesak, NC State Chaplain, talked to our entire parish about the value of being a Knight. That drive resulted in 51 potential candidates. Our Grand Knight Jim Duffy and our Membership Director Sam Waters and his Membership team have been very busy calling those candidates to set them up for First Degrees.

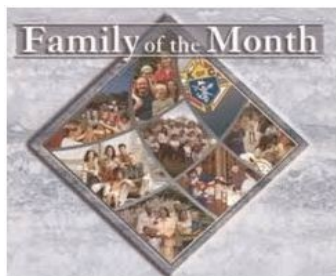
